Leon Rupnik

**Leon Rupnik**, also known as **Lav Rupnik** or **Lev Rupnik** (August 10, 1880 – September 4, 1946) was a [Slovene general](#) during the [Kingdom of Yugoslavia](#) who collaborated with the [Fascist Italian](#) and [Nazi German](#) occupation forces during [World War II](#). Known for his visceral [antisemitic](#) and openly pro-Nazi views already prior to the war,<sup>[1]</sup> Rupnik served as the President of the Provincial Government of the Nazi-occupied [Province of Ljubljana](#) from November 1943 to early May 1945. Between September 1944 and early May 1945, he also served as chief inspector of the Slovene [Slovenian Home Guard](#)

On 5 May 1945, Leon Rupnik fled to [Austria](#) with a small group of 20 collaborators. He was arrested by the British in on July 23 and returned to [Yugoslavia](#) on January 1946. He was put on trial alongside [Rösener](#) and others, and was sentenced to death for treason on 30 August 1946<sup>[27]</sup>. He was [executed by firing squad](#) on September 4, 1946 at Ljubljana's [Žale](#) cemetery, and was buried the same day in an unmarked grave
